BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED , that if any fee officials, as enumerated in Section 8-22-104, T.C.A., provisions of the preceding paragraph shall not apply to those particular officials.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any amendment to the budget shall be approved as provided in Section 5-9-407, T.C.A., The Director of Schools must receive approval of the Board of Education for transfers within each major category of the budget, and approval of both the Board of Education and Board of County Commissioners for transfers between major categories as required by law. One copy of each amendment shall be filed with the County Clerk, one copy with the Chairman of the Budget Committee, and one copy with each divisional or departmental head concerned. The reason(s) for each transfer shall be clearly stated; however, this section shall in no case whatsoever be construed as authorizing transfers from one fund to another, but shall apply solely to transfers within a certain fund.

transfers within a certain fund. SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any appropriations made by this resolution which cover the same purpose for which a specific appropriation. The salary, wages, or remuneration of each officer, employee, or agent of the County shall not be in excess of the amounts authorized by existing law or as set forth in the estimate of expenditures which accompanies this resolution. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any resolution which may hereafter be presented to the Board of County Commissioners providing for appropriations in addition to those made by this Budget Appropriation Resolution shall specifically provide sufficient revenue or other funds, actually to be provided during the year in which the expenditure is to be made, to meet such additional appropriation. There is hereby designated three million dollars in current fund balances in the General Fund to be held in reserve in the General Fund from proceeds related to the sale of the Hospital in addition to those amounts currently reserved for purposes. Any appropriations made from assigned balances shall hereafter be clearly stated and documented. Said appropriating resolution shall be submitted to and approved by the State Director of Local Finance after its adoption as provided by Section 9-21-403, T.C.A. SECTION 6. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Clerk are hereby authorized to borrow money on revenue anticipation notes, provided such notes are first approved by the Director of Local Finance, to pay for the expenses herein authorized until the taxes and other revenue for the year 2018-2019 have been appropriations of each individual fund and shall be used only to pay the expenses and other requirements of the fund for which the Ioan is made. 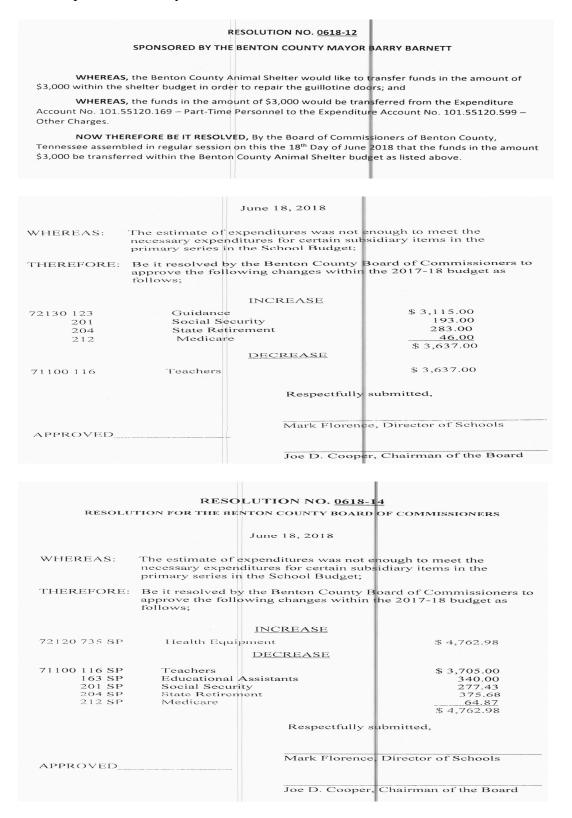

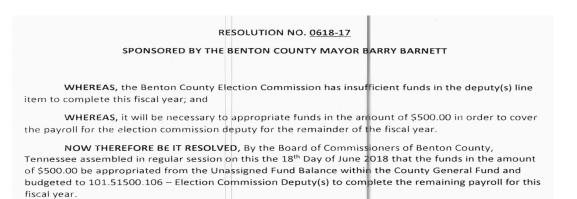
