Mark Ward, Election Commissioner, discussed the issue of Resolution 0716-04 and stated that it is legal to change the number of commissioners and it needs to be put on the ballot. Mr. Ward suggests getting a copy of the Private Act 1939 for reference on the issue. Mr. Ward also said the resolution could be rescinded.

Mr. Johnson, County Attorney, was asked for his opinion and stated the staggered terms in the resolution was a problem and that it should be rescinded.

On a roll call vote, all present voted Aye. Motion Carries.

#### RESOLUTION NO. 1119-01

#### SPONSORED BY COMMISSIONERS RONNIE HOPPER AND DARRELL HICKS

LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE: BUDGET COMMITTEE

WHEREAS, in previous action by the full legislative body, Resolution 1015-06 was tabled and postponed until the November commission meeting; and

WHEREAS, in previous action by the full legislative body, Resolution 0716-04 was passed reducing the commission to 12 with 2 commissioners representing each district beginning with the August election of 2022; and

WHEREAS, this resolution also stated the county commission would have staggered terms and was described as the following:

The Benton County Board of Commissioners shall consist of twelve (12) Commissioners, with two (2) members of the board being elected by the qualified voters in each district on a non-partisan basis. Commissioners shall be elected in either Seat A or Seat B in each district. Commissioners shall be elected to to staggered four (4) year terms so that every two(2) years the terms of one-half (½) the Benton County Board of Commissioners will expire, with the terms of County Commissioners holding Seat A expiring at the same time and the terms of County Commissioners holding Seat B expiring at the same time. Persons elected in the regular August general elections shall take office on September 1 following the election and shall serve until their successors are duly elected and qualified.

To establish staggered terms in the August 2022 general election, County Commissioner seats shall be assigned Seat A and Seat B. At the regular August 2022 elections, the person receiving the highest number of votes shall be elected in seat A to a four (4) year term. At the regular August 2022 elections, the person receiving the 2<sup>nd</sup> highest number of votes shall be elected in seat B to a two (2) year term. At the regular August 2024 elections, Commissioners in Seat B shall be elected to four (4) year terms in Districts 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6. At the regular August 2026 elections, Commissioners in Seat A shall be elected to four (4) year terms in Districts 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6. Thereafter, all commissioners shall be elected to four (4) year terms as each member's term expires.

WHEREAS, it is the recommendation of commissioners Ronnie Hopper and Darrell Hicks to rescind this Resolution 0716-04 and to set the county commission back to 18 board members without staggered terms.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** By the Board of Commissioners of Benton County, Tennessee assembled in regular session on this the 19<sup>th</sup> Day of November 2018 that the full legislative body will rescind Resolution 0716-04.
