WHEREAS, the Benton County Board of County Commissioners has previously voted to request the State General Assembly to amend the Benton County Private Act of 1994, Chapter 189 to add State Government owned hotels, lodges and campgrounds as entities that must collect and remit the county occupancy tax

WHEREAS, the State General Assembly has honored the request of the Benton County Board of County Commissioners and recently amended the Private Act of 1994, Chapter 189 pending a subsequent 2/3rd majority vote of the Benton County Board of County Commissioners to confirm;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Benton County, Tennessee, meeting in regular session on this 20th day of July, 2020,

Section 1. That the County Occupancy Tax be amended by a 2/3rd majority vote of the county commission as detailed in the proposed amendment to the Private Act of 1994, Chapter 189.

Section 3. That, for purposes of collection of this tax by State Government owned hotels, lodges and campground operators in Benton County, the effective date will be upon passage.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Benton County Clerk shall send copies of this approved resolution to the Tennessee Secretary of State after it is voted upon by the Board of County Commission on a Part of County Tennessee

COUNTY MAYOR'S NOTES FOR COMMISSION MEETING: JULY 20, 2020

The state comptroller's office has certified our budget (as of July 10th)! This is the benefit of a timely passage of the budget and probably the earliest such certification in decades. Many thanks to county commission for your efforts and commitment to pass the budget on time.

We (Mayor's office and Budget Committee) are looking at employee step raises and a better structuring of our human resources guidance and payroll structure. We know salary and pay review is long-overdue, but the timing has not been well. Our main focus was on passing a budget in an assessment reappraisal year which is a complicated endeavor. Now that such efforts are out of the way and successful, our focus is now to review the county administrative and law enforcement employee salary scales and human resources guidance. We have been in discussions with an HR Consultant (The Summit HR Group) out of Knoxville, TN and have secured a mutual partnership agreement and will commence work immediately. More information to follow as this continues forward.

I met with West TN River Basin Authority Director David Blackwood on Friday, July 3. We met at the "Old Depot/Fairgrounds area to look over our Cane Creek flooding which impacts our fairgrounds area in a negative way. I walked away from that onsite meeting with a commitment from WTRBA that they would begin engineering review. We located multiple creek obstructions that will be addressed as soon as equipment is available from other projects. This alone will improve the water flows. We looked over the curved area at Midway Materials and he saw a few complications. From our review, I will be working with the USACE (Army Corp of Engineers) to begin flood mapping studies via a couple of programs they offer. Director Blackwood, (along with our county engineer Alton Hethcoat) will contact the State Revolving Fund on a project redevelopment of the wastewater/sewer lines that run across the area and local creeks to see if a redesign project can be funded by the state. If successful, this could really transform the Old Depot area and make it ripe for business development.

Our next County Mayor's Townhall meeting will be in Holladay, on the last Tuesday of the month (July 28th) at 6PM. Any and all county officials are welcome to attend and weigh in on discussions.

Ag Extension and Commodities are now operating fully in the Annex Building.

Our County EMA Operations Center is moving forward now that the State ECD has approved our plan and environmental surveys. We are NOT moving forward with a joint project with E-911. Although they had originally sought a partnership for a mutually needed and beneficial facility, the long-term impact of the agreement was not favorable or commensurate to our county's fiscal commitment. The E-911 Board was committing \$800,000 upfront payment toward the building construction in exchange for a 40-year lease and operating agreement. Myself, the county engineer and attorney met with the E-911 board to express our concerns. \$800,000 divided by 40 years/480 months came to a quick calculation of \$1666 per month. The county's position was that sum does not equate to the financial commitment we would assume in operations, utility, and building maintenance cost over a long period of time. After thought and consideration, we both felt it was better to embark on our own individual capital endeavors. We support E-911 and are still committed to their success and mission as they are our EMA

operation. In the end, we both felt our futures are bright and prosperous and we are both excited about the upcoming progress of our emergency management operation center.

We conducted a "Virtual" Townhall with Senator Marsha Blackburn on Wednesday, July 1. We had the honor of also having join us US Senate Candidate Bill Hagerty, who is seeking the republican nomination. Knowing a potential US Senator chose to be in Benton County and get to learn and hear our concerns was flattering enough, but to do this via a live discussion with US Senator Blackburn shows me promise that Benton County concerns will be heard in Washington and with our federal leaders.

We are reviewing our TVA PILOT/Lake Acreage allocations and are preparing a presentation to state leaders over our concerns that Benton County, although giving up the lion's share of TVA utilized acreage, is not getting our financial fair-share.

GRANTS: PATSY CLINE MEMORIAL PARK

We have applied for a \$75,000 Tourism Enhancement Grant which if successful, will be applied at the Patsy Cline Memorial Park. It will cost the county 5% of that cost or \$3750. We are looking to construct an earthen amphitheater and stage facility for entertainment events, as well as improving parking and drainage along the pathways. We have adequate additional funds from the Governor's Grant to supplement the cost of this project which might be in excess to the grant.

We are in the preparation phases of preparing TDOT grant applications for sidewalk projects in Holladay and Big Sandy. These will be "multimodal" type projects of \$1,000,000 each, which will cost the county only a 5% match of \$50,000 each. We have allocated these funds into our Capital Projects budget accounts via the Governor's Grant we recently were awarded.

GRANTS: ROWSEY STREET PARK

The County owns two adjacent lots on Rowsey Street. I have discussed with a Parks Architect and Engineering firm to look into a Blue Cross / Blue Shield Health Place Grant (100% funded) to turn these lots into a community park. We believe that since these parcels sit in a minority section of town, which is very depicting of unique health issues (high blood pressure, diabetes, heart disease) that would be a very attractive candidate for a grant award. This section is also historic. We believe the minority ethnic demographic in Benton County is severely neglected. Such a project like this will go a very long way to improving an area that is in bad need of such.

GRANTS: TDOT MULTIMODAL

Our Engineer has submitted applications for a 95/5 TDOT Multimodal Grant for a sidewalk project for the City of Big Sandy. This grant, valued at \$1,000,000 will cost the county \$50,000. We have allocated that funding from the Governor's Grant recently received. We are pursuing an identical grant for the Holladay Community.

GRANTS: AG ENTERPRISE FUND

Our Engineer has submitted an application for an AG Enterprise Fund Grant with the TN Dept of Agriculture. Although our application was rated highly, the funding for such grant has not been awarded. We will continue to seek this opportunity for supplemental funding for the construction of our Ag Civic Complex and Farmers Market. The value of such grant can range up to \$100,000 at no cost to the county.

3-STAR PROGRAM STATUS

Our 3-Star Grant quarterly report is complete and we are awaiting our next committee meeting. We have secured a verbal agreement with Bethel University who will commence classes once we can finalize a formal agreement and statement of understanding. Dr. Randy Shannon is facilitating this action. Our hopes are once we complete our Agricultural Civic Complex and Farmers Market, the classes will move from the county career and technical center to the Ag Extension Office.

COUNTY SPORTS COMPLEX

The timbering is complete at the ballpark and we have the cash in hand for pursuing some parks and recreation grants to extend, enhance, and expand our park capacity as far as softball fields are concerned. With the obtainment of grant funding, we believe we can leverage further the development of a soccer field complex adjacent to the area where the sheriff's inmate garden is located. We hope to know more of our grant applications as they come open in the Fall timeframe. Our strategy is to leverage the \$150,000 from timber sales into additional parks & recreation grant funding that will amount from \$600,000 to \$1,000,000 at no additional cost to the taxpayers other than the \$150,000 already in the bank. We will also use \$50,000 of the governor's grant money as the final step in paving and improving the roadway to and from the hallpark

JOINT USE FIRING RANGE FOR COUNTY AND CITY OF BIG SANDY AND CAMDEN AUTHORIZED PERSONNEL

This is a facility that will aid our law enforcement throughout the county to utilize for training. Camden Police Chief George Smith has been asked to represent the City of Camden in advising the Property Committee on the location of this firing range and what we envision over the coming years. Our sheriff's dept will have full access to this site as well as it will potentially aid the TWRA in local "Hunter's Safety Courses". This site will also be open to county authorized personnel for firearm training.
