EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 7 (EXTENSION of EO NO. 3) DECLARATION OF PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the President of the United States, the Governor of the State of Tennessee, and the Mayors of a number of municipalities in the state of Tennessee have made emergency declarations related to the COVID-19 pandemic, and have recognized it as a public health emergency; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee and Benton County have recently experienced record numbers of new COVID-19 cases and COVID-19 hospitalizations; and

WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and Tennessee Department of Health (TDH) advise the use of cloth or other types of face coverings to slow the spread of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, immediate action to slow the spread of COVID-19 in our county and communities is necessary in order to be able to safely allow governmental operations to continue, businesses and schools to remain open; reduce the demands on our local healthcare professionals and healthcare systems, and

WHEREAS, widespread use of face coverings is believed to be effective in slowing the spread of COVID-19 by reducing the chances of symptomatic and asymptomatic people transmitting the virus to others, especially when used together with other protocols including 6-foot social distancing and hand hygiene; and

WHEREAS, on July 3, 2020, Governor Bill Lee signed Executive Order 54, strongly urging all persons to wear cloth face coverings or other similar coverings in public settings where being in close proximity to others is anticipated, and on December 22, 2020, Governor Bill Lee signed Executive Order 73, again strongly urging all persons to wear cloth face coverings; and

WHEREAS, Governor Lee, through Executive Order 54 and Executive Order 73, delegated authority to county mayors in the 89 counties that do not have a locally-run health department to issue orders requiring the wearing of face coverings within their jurisdictions, subject to certain limitations, for the purposes of slowing the spread of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, the numbers of positive COVID-19 cases in Benton County and surrounding counties have significantly increased; and

WHEREAS, the Mutual Aid and Emergency and Disaster Assistance Agreement Act of 2004, Tenn. Code Ann. § 58-8-101 et seq., authorizes the mayor to declare a local state of emergency affecting such official's jurisdiction by executive order consistent with and in accordance with Tenn. Code Ann. § 58-2-110(3)(A)(v); and

WHEREAS, Tenn. Code Ann. § 58-2-110(3)(A)(v)(a) provides political subdivisions of the Tennessee State Government, Benton County, the power and authority to waive the procedures and formalities otherwise required for the performance of public work and taking whatever prudent action necessary to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of the community; and

WHEREAS, the declaration of a local state of emergency may entitle Benton County to cost reimbursement as provided in Tenn. Code Ann. § 58-8-111; and

WHEREAS, the County Mayor and designees are hereby authorized to request and respond to requests of aid from other jurisdictions when necessary; and

WHEREAS, the County Mayor is authorized to conduct the activities of the County and to make all necessary decisions related to personnel and the day-to-day needs of the County; and

WHEREAS, Autumn Ratliff, Big Sandy Mayor, and Roger Pafford, Camden Mayor, acknowledge the necessity for this Declaration Of Public Health Emergency, and are in full support of its issuance for the benefit and protection of our communities and citizens.

NOW, THEREFORE, PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY DELEGATED BY EXECUTIVE ORDER 54 AND EXECUTIVE ORDER 73 AND PURSUANT TO GOVERNOR LEE'S RECOGNITION OF A CONTINUING STATE OF EMERGENCY AND MAJOR DISASTER RELATED TO COVID-19, I, Brett Lashlee, Mayor of Benton County, Tennessee, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by all applicable laws, issues a Declaration of Emergency related to the COVID-19 pandemic; and

IT IS ORDERED that cloth or other face coverings that cover the nose and mouth of a person to impede the spread of the virus during speaking, coughing, sneezing or other action, shall be required in Benton County, Tennessee, within all public-accessible areas of commercial business establishments; in public outdoor areas where social distancing of at least six feet cannot be maintained; and within the publicly-accessible areas of business offices where there is direct interaction with the public and social distancing of at least six feet cannot be maintained. A "commercial business establishment" means any establishment that sells goods or services, or a combination thereof, including but not limited to grocery stores, restaurants, lobbies and public spaces in hotels and other places of lodging, pharmacies, banks, bars, salons, retail stores, medical and dental offices, and entertainment and sports venues.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that all commercial business establishments shall comply with social distancing guidelines and maintain a high level of sanitation and employee hygiene in line with CDC guidance. Furthermore, to prevent mass community spread of COVID-19 at retail stores and grocery stores, the following additional guidelines are being instituted:

Allow no more than 10% of stated fire capacity in the store at a time (note that this
reduced capacity is approximately 250 square feet per person). Require staff to count
the number of customers entering and exiting the store and to enforce limits. Businesses
exceeding 100,000 square foot per person shall not exceed 300 customers at any given
time.

- Clearly mark 6-foot spacing in lines and other high-traffic areas and consider ways to encourage spacing if there are lines outside. Consider posting signage or using ropes to direct customers and to limit bottlenecks/encourage flow in high-density areas of stores.
- 3. Designate employees to monitor social distancing and assist customers.
- 4. Maximize space between customers and employees at checkout.
- 5. Incorporate a separate entry and exit process if more than one entrance exists.
- 6. Designate employee(s) to ensure the cleaning guidelines set by the CDC are followed.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Order does not apply to:

- 1. Any person who is under age 12;
- 2. Any person who cannot safely wear a face covering because he/she has trouble breathing due to an underlying health condition or another bona fide medical or health-related reason for not wearing a face covering;
- 3. Anyone who is incapacitated or otherwise unable to remove a face covering without assistance;
- 4. Persons in a private residence;
- 5. Persons who are outdoors, unless the person cannot substantially maintain appropriate 6-foot social distancing from others outside of the person's household;
- 6. Persons while eating or drinking;
- 7. Persons in a place of worship (unless a face covering is required by the place of worship), although persons in places of worship are strongly encouraged to wear face coverings to slow the spread of COVID-19;
- 8. Persons within private motor vehicles, unless such vehicle is being used for public transportation or a vehicle for hire;
- 9. Persons working under conditions where appropriate social distancing of at least six feet from others outside the person's household is substantially maintained;
- 10. Persons present in government facilities, or on government premises, who shall be subject to the rules and regulations of the governmental entity operating the facility or premises. Persons present in the public areas of all Benton County government facilities will wear cloth or other face coverings, subject to the age and health restrictions outlined herein, and subject to number 11, below. Other local governmental entities may issue their own directives regarding their facilities;

- 11. Persons in a voting site for the purpose of voting or administering an election; although such persons are strongly encouraged to wear face coverings to slow the spread of COVID-19;
- 12. Persons who are engaging in strenuous exercise and/or physical activity, provided, however, that such persons shall maintain 6-foot social distancing when not wearing a face covering;
- 13. Persons for whom wearing a face covering would pose a safety or security risk.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that businesses and facilities subject to this Order shall post signage at public entrances informing patrons of the requirement to wear a mask within the establishment, and shall enforce the requirement within the establishment.

This local order constitutes an order promulgated pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 58, Chapter 2, Part 1. While it is the hope and expectation that Benton County residents will comply with this Order out of a sense of civic duty and respect for their fellow residents, and attempts at education and communication are the preferred methods of obtaining compliance, state law provides for enforcement of this Order if necessary. Pursuant to Executive Order 54 and Executive Order 73 and Tennessee Code Annotated §58-2-120, violation of this Order shall constitute a Class A misdemeanor.

This Order shall become effective Wednesday, January 20, 2021 at 11:59 p.m. and will expire on January 27, 2021 at 11:59 p.m., unless sooner cancelled or unless extended.

RESOLUTION NO. <u>20210119-01</u> RESOLUTION SPONSORED BY COMMISSIONERS ROCKY PRESSON & WARD PLANT LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE: BUDGET COMMITTEE

WHEREAS, the December 15, 2020 trial balance from the Benton County Trustee's Office shows Benton County having approximately \$18,918,215 dollars being invested in four separate banks; and

WHEREAS, the \$18,918,215 invested dollars include the school fund, highway fund and the general fund; and

WHEREAS, Benton Counties investment income is found on page four of our counties 2020-2021 fiscal year budget. Account numbers 44100 and 44110 shows the 2019 audit numbers for invest income being \$231,763 dollars, and found in Benton County Trustee's records show actual dollars for 2020 investments being \$300,685 dollars; and

WHEREAS, the December 15, 2020 trial balance sheet shows all investment dollars as:

dollars \$3,672,658 APEX BANK FIRST BANK \$1,526,794 dollars CARROLL BANK & TRUST \$6,616,049 dollars \$7,102,714 dollars

LOCAL INVESTMENT POOL WHEREAS, excise tax is a tax paid by banks based on the earnings in a given county; and

WHEREAS, information provided from the Tennessee Department of Revenue shows our local banks and the payments made to Benton County from the excise tax; and

WHEREAS, excise payments made to Benton County in 2020:

\$284,014 APEX BANK Four payments totaling REGIONS BANK \$ 3,825 \$ 2,730 CARROLL BANK & TRUST WORLD FINANCE \$ 000.00 FIRST BANK

LOCAL GOVERNMENT INVESTMENT POOL \$ 000.00

WHEREAS, Apex Bank in 2020 paid 96.3% percent of all excise taxes received by Benton County; and WHEREAS, on the December 15, 2020 trial balance from the Benton County Trustee showed only 19.4% percent of Benton County investment dollars are being invested in Apex Bank; and

WHEREAS, the Local Government Investment Pool in which Benton County has greater than 7 million dollars invested in, is operated by the Tennessee State Treasury. Records will reflect an interest rate high of 2.41% in April 2019 and records will show an interest rate low of 0.19% in November 2020, and records show the Local Government Investment Pool pays Benton County no

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, By the Board of Commissioners of Benton County, Tennessee assembled in regular session on this the 19th Day of January 2021 that our Benton County Mayor, Brett Lashlee, and our Benton County Trustee, Sherry Beasley, give great consideration to the study and research of the benefits and/or harm of investing all Benton County Investment dollars only in county banks, whom are properly paying Benton County Excise Taxes and greatly consider investing no dollars in the banking entities whom are not properly paying excise taxes to Benton County.

LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE: NONE
WHEREAS, on March 11, 2020 the World Health Organization declared the COVID-19 outbreak a global pandemic; and WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020 President Trump declared a National State of Emergency in response to the COVID-19 pandemic;

WHEREAS, on October 11, 2020 the White House Coronavirus Taskforce, in a state report for Tennessee, suggested a state wide mask mandate must be implemented to stop the increasing spread among residents that is likely to overrun hospitals, doctors, medical staff in the coming weeks; and

WHEREAS, Fox News Reported on December 25th, 2020 fewer than 30 Tennessee counties have instituted a mandated to wear a mask in public; and

WHEREAS, first responders and medical providers attribute a significant number of new COVID-19 cases to citizens residing in counties not mandating the wearing of masks moving freely throughout the state to conduct business, work, school, and recreation;

WHEREAS, on December 18, 2020 Protect My Care, a group of more than 50 Tennessee doctors, delivered a message to Tennessee Governor Bill Lee, that our medical community is not divided on wearing masks in our great state of Tennessee and asked the Governor to "Mask Mandate Now"; and

WHEREAS, on December 16, 2020 COVID-19 set a single day case record of 11,410 new cases; and

WHEREAS, Friday, December 25th, 2020 the Tennessee State Health Department reported 2,944 citizens currently being hospitalized with COVID-19, and on January 3rd, 2021 the New York Times reported 3,371 people being hospitalized in Tennessee, which is an increase of 12.7% percent since December 25th.

WHEREAS, on December 29th, 2020 the U.S. confirms the first case of a new COVID-19 strain, Colorado health officials identified

the first new case caused by a contagious United Kingdom variant. The new strain could be as much as 70% percent more transmissible. Since this initial announcement, cases of the new strain have been reported in both Florida and California; and WHEREAS, MSNBC reported on January 4th, 2021 that the Prime Minister announced a National Lockdown for England amid a rise in cases and the spread of the new variant COVID-19 virus.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, By the Board of Commissioners of Benton County, Tennessee assembled in regular session on this the 19th Day of January 2021 that the Benton County Mayor and the County Commission express its extreme concern with regards to the arrival of the new COVID-19 mutation coming from the U.K. and having a potential third COVID-19 wave, requests the Governor of Tennessee, Bill Lee, to issue a state wide Mask Mandate in all public settings to better protect all residents of Tennessee until all residents have been given the opportunity for the COVID-19 vaccine.

WHEREAS, the West Tennessee River Basin Authority is working to submit a proposal for the Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) Grant Program through FEMA; and WHEREAS, one of the locations that has shown a persistent need and meets the qualifications of this program is Cane Creek from

Natchez Trace Road to South Forrest Avenue; and
