COUNTY MAYOR'S NOTES FOR COMMISSION MEETING: FEBRUARY 16, 2021

WELCOME

After last month's meeting, I took some notes and wanted to convey some ideas and suggestions going forward as to how we need to work to improve our monthly business meeting. Personally, I entertain and enjoy open discussions in meetings as it's the best way to really get informed on issues and resolution request, etc. However, I believe the public is getting tired out on our regular business meetings lasting so long. There is room for improvement for us all and we should work to hone our oratory elements of the meeting if we are to make our regular monthly meeting more time efficient. Having said that, I propose the following:

- 1-We have to Validate and improve the Resolution submission process. Please vet your resolutions via a peer review with the Chairman, County Mayor, CTAS, or TCSA. These resolutions need to be ready by the Friday before agenda preparation, but no later than the first Monday of the month. I have noticed multiple resolutions that are improperly worded, or maybe not even necessary or that promote a public informational discussion not related to the agenda.
- 2-To reduce business meeting floor discussions, members need to attend as many committee meetings as possible to reduce confusion and gain a proper understanding of the issue. If you come to the regular meeting uninformed or misunderstanding a proposal, the regular business meeting probably isn't going to help. Its ok to ask your peers, or the County Mayor, or another informational resource prior to the monthly meeting.
- 3-Using the Regular Business Meeting for grandstanding purposes will no longer be tolerated. The floor of our regular business meeting isn't the place to discuss personal insinuations, accusations, or differences or to pander to the live audience via grand-standing. The Chairman has the ability to shut this action and communication down. There isn't anything that comes up in a regular business meeting that you have stewed on for over a week that cannot be addressed directly with someone who can provide direct clarity of the issue. If you are saving the issue for a live audience and it is not related DIRECTLY to the agenda, the Chairman will begin calling the member out of order and cutting off the discussion.
- 4-Training yourself on Roberts Rules of Order and Protocols of Conducting a Legislative Meeting. It is impossible to learn enough in a 1-day orientation given by CTAS at the Commissioner Orientation Seminar held every 4 years or via an online session. I would like to ask the Legislative Body to look into local orientation for new members that is separate from the CTAS meetings. We can walk through the processes above as well as many other legislative and administrative processes and protocols. Have we ever been orientated on the "Rule of Order"? That was not covered in the state orientation, but is your main operating protocol for local meetings. We can improve our Parliamentary Processes and Procedures, but only if you are willing to commit to this and take it to heart. This will aid us in our legislative meetings on every level. COUNTY MAYOR'S NOTES FOR COMMISSION MEETING: FEBRUARY 16, 2021

COVID-19

Back in the late Fall and prior to Thanksgiving we saw a tremendous escalation in COVID-19 related infections and deaths, basically doubling over the course of 5-6 weeks. Our death rate doubled from 13 to 26 and our confirmed cases went from 632 to 1110. We ranked 22nd lowest in Tennessee and was on the verge of jumping to 23rd, but had climbed from being 11th lowest earlier in the summer so those numbers were not favoring a safer future for our citizens.

These dramatic increases prompted the initiation of a Local Mask Mandate, via a County State of Emergency. This mandate did not come hastily and much discussion and counsel were solicited from our local health, emergency, and business community. We took a conservative approach of observation, information and data gathering, and confirmation as to whether the public was ready for such abrupt change in our social behavior. Unfortunately, sometimes harsh realities of the impact of this threat had to be experienced within the community and by late Fall I believe public sentiment has definitely swayed in favor. As a result, from the outset of the initial COVID-19 Emergency Declaration by our Governor and President on March 11-12th, 2020, a Local Mask Mandate was issued effective December 23rd.

Although everyone has an opinion on whether Mask work or not, in the 6 weeks since the initiation of the Mask Mandate here are the numbers:

We have dropped from 22^{nd} to 12^{th} , and sit on the verge of being the 11^{th} lowest impacted county.

The increase in our death rate has slowed by 50%

Our active cases have dropped from 144 to 44!

Vaccinations have now been introduced and continue to increase in inventory.

We are getting better control of this virus, but we cannot take this viral threat likely as we are still seeing the pain and losses of our citizens to COVID-19. I do see a lifting of the mandate around the corner soon, but I hope our citizens will continue to invest the efforts needed to stay safe and help keep others safe.

COUNTY EMPLOYEE HANDBOOK

Still under review from elected officials and will soon be discussed with county employees for feedback and concerns. Our HR Consultant is now reviewing job descriptions and salary & wage compensation analysis. Sheriff's Department is currently working on theirs. We hope to have all of the feedback on these within the next couple of months and we will look to have the County Commission review and adopt/reject these to go into effect July 1, 2021. Additionally, what I believe will be a good plan going forward is for the County Commission to hear suggestions and concerns every October & November, make the new changes in December to go into effect on January 1st of each year there is a change or addition to the handbooks.

COUNTY MAYOR'S NOTES FOR COMMISSION MEETING: FEBRUARY 16, 2021

PROPERTY ACQUISITIONS:

We have recently seen the acquisition of three properties near the interstate, two by the Industrial Development Board and one under Benton County Solid Waste. Our future plans for the Solid Waste property is for a transfer station/convenience center once we are able to secure adequate funding for such operation. Our hope is there will be Solid Waste related grants open up soon, but if not, we will look at our Waste Management revenues as a future source to fund this operation.

Additionally, Solid Waste Board Chair Ronnie Hopper and myself are still searching for a property in the north end of the county. We have our interest in a particular property just inside the city limits. This property may also give us the option of remodeling the building and opening an Annex that will house a County Clerk, Trustee, and Sheriff's satellite offices which will be a huge benefit to the citizens in the north end of our county.

GRANTS: BROADBAND

Charter/Spectrum has secured a \$5.2 million dollar grant for upgrades in the City of Camden area. The addition of this grant now brings the total Broadband Grant investment to Benton County to just over \$11,000,000 with more coming. Additionally, Benton Electric is running a vast amount of "dark fiber" throughout the county which will further aid in future development and grants for Benton County.

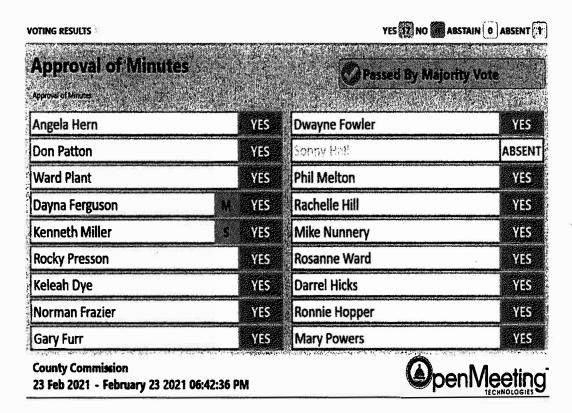

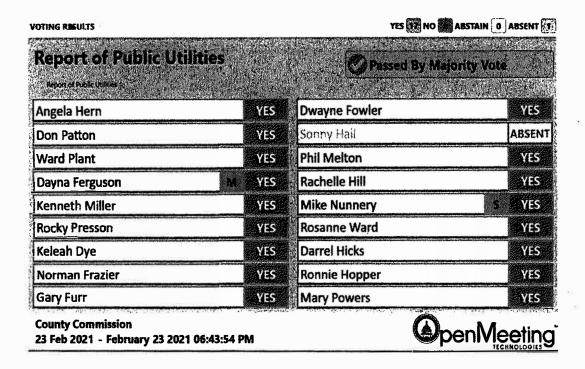

Section 1. Authority. The Notes herein authorized shall be issued pursuant to Title 9, Chapter 21, Tennessee Code Annotated, as amended, and other applicable provisions of law.

Section 3. Terms of the Notes. The Notes shall be designated "School System Capital Outlay Notes, Series 2021". The Notes shall be issued in registered form, without coupons. The Notes shall be numbered from 1 upwards, shall be dated the date of issuance and delivery, or such other date as the County Mayor shall determine, shall be sold at not less than the par amount thereof, and shall bear interest at a rate not to exceed 2% per annum, such interest being payable at such times as agreed upon with the purchaser of such Notes, but in no event less than semiannually each year commencing six months from the dated date or such date as shall be designated by the County Mayor (the "Interest Payment Date"), and shall mature not later than the end of the tenth fiscal year following the fiscal year in which the Notes are issued. Each year the Notes are outstanding the County shall retire principal on the Notes in an amount that is estimated to be at least equal to an amortization which reflects level debt service on the Notes. If the Notes are issued through the Termessee Municipal Bond Fund ("TMBF"), alternative loan program, the rate of interest will include an annual fee equal to 15 basis points (0.15%), payable to TMBF by the bank, to be paid from each periodic payment of interest on the Notes, based on the outstanding principal amount of the Notes.

The Notes shall be unchaser of the Notes.

Interest on the Notes shall be payable by wire transfer or by check or other form of draft of the "Note Registrar," as such term is hereinafter defined, deposited by the Note Registrar in the United States mail, first class postage prepaid, in sealed envelopes, addressed to the owner of such Notes, as of the applicable Interest Payment Date, at their respective addresses as shown on the Registration Books of the County maintained by the Note Registrar as of the close of business fifteen (15) calendar days preceding the next Interest Payment Date. All payments of the principal of and interest on the Notes shall be made in any coin or currency of the United States of America which, on the date of payment thereof, shall be legal tender for the payment of public and private debts.

Section 4. Redemption. The Notes shall not be subject to redemption, in whole or in part, prior to maturity; provided however, at the option of the County upon fifteen (15) calendar days written notice to the registered owner, and with the consent of the registered owner, the County may prepay the Notes in full at the price of par plus a 1% prenium, and secreted interest to the date of redemption. Notwithstanding the above, the County may make additional principal payments on the Notes upon fifteen (15) calendar days written notice to the registered owner.

Section 5. Execution. The Notes shall be executed in the name of the County; shall bear the manual signature of the County Mayor; shall be countersigned by the County Clerk of the County (the "County Clerk"), with his or her manual signature; and, shall have printed or impressed thereon the official seal of the County. In the event any officer whose signature appears on the Notes shall cease to be such officer, such signature shall nevertheless be valid and sufficient for all purposes. The Notes shall be issued in typed, printed, or photocopied form, or any combination thereof, substantially in the form attached hereto as Exhibit "A", with such minor changes therein or such variations thereof as the County Mayor may deem necessary or desirable, the blanks to be appropriately completed by the County Mayor prior to the issuance of the Notes.

Section 6. Registration, Negotiability, and Payment. (a) The County Clerk of the County is hereby appointed the note registrar and paying agent (the "Note Registrar"), and as such shall establish and maintain suitable books (the "Registration Books"), for recording the registration, conversion, and payment of the Notes, and shall also perform such other duties as may be required in connection with any of the foregoing. The Note Registrar is hereby authorized to authenticate and deliver the Notes of the original purchaser thereof, or as it may designate, upon receipt by the County of the proceeds of the safe thereof and to authenticate and deliver Notes in exchange for Notes of the same principal amount delivered for transfer upon receipt of the Notes to be transferred in proper documentation as herein described. The Notes shall not be valid for any purpose unless authenticated by the Note Registrar by the manual signature of the Note Registrar on the certificate set forth in Exhibit "A" hereto. The Notes shall be fully registered as to both principal and interest and shall be fully negotiable upon proper endorsement by the registred owner thereof. No transfer of any Notes shall be valid unless such transfer is noted upon the Registration Books and until such Note is surrendered, canded, and exchanged for a new Note which shall be issued to the transferee, subject to all the conditions contained herein. Principal on the Notes shall be paid at maturity upon presentation or surrender of the Notes at the principal office of the Note Registrar, and payment in such manner shall forever discharge and release the obligation of the County to the extent of the principal and interest so paid.

(b) In the event that any amount payable on any Note as interest shall at any time exceed the rate of interest lawfully chargeable thereon under applicable en any such excess shall, to the extent of such excess, be applied against the principal of such Note as a prepayment thereof without penalty, and such excess shall not be reed to be interest. All rates of interest specified herein shall be computed on the basis of a three hundred sixty (360) day year composed of twelve (12) months of thirty (30) of the principal of the prin

- Section 7. Transfer of Notes. Each Note shall be transferable only on the Registration Books maintained by the Note Registrar at the principal office of the Note Registrar, upon the surrender for cancellation thereof at the principal office of the Note Registrar, together with an assignment of such Note duly executed by the owner thereof or its attorney or legal representative, and upon payment of the charges hereinafter provided, and subject to such other limitations and conditions as may be provided therein or herein. Upon the cancellation of any such Note, the Note Registrar shall, in exchange for the surrendered Note or Notes, deliver in the name of the transferce or transferces a new Note or Notes of authorized denominations, of the same aggregate principal amount, maturity, and rate of interest as such surrendered Note or Notes of authorized denominations, of the same aggregate principal amount, maturity, and rate of interest as such surrendered Note or Notes, and the transferce or transferces shall take such new Note or Notes of subject to all of the conditions herein contained.
- Section 8. Regulations with Respect to Transfers. In all cases in which the privilege of transferring Notes is exercised, the County shall execute, and the Note Registrar shall deliver, Notes in accordance with the provisions of this Resolution. For every transfer of Notes, whether temporary or definitive, the County and the Note Registrar may make a charge, unless otherwise herein to the contrary expressly provided, sufficient to pay for any tax, fee, or other governmental charge required to be paid with respect to such transfer, all of which taxes, fees, and other governmental charges shall be paid to the County by the entity requesting such exchange or transfer as a condition precedent to the exercise of the privilege of making such transfer. Neither the County nor the Note Registrar shall be obligated to transfer any Note during the fifteen (15) calendar days next preceding the maturity date of the Notes or any call for redemption.
- Section 9. Mutilated, Lost, Stolen, or Destroyed Notes. In the event any Note issued hereunder shall become mutilated, or be lost, stolen, or destroyed, such Note shall, at the written request of the registered owner, be cancelled on the Registration Books and a new Note shall be authenticated and delivered, corresponding in all aspects but number to the mutilated, lost, stolen, or destroyed Note or Notes come into possession of the registered owner, such Notes shall be returned to the Note Registrar for destroyed Note to Notes come into possession of the registered owner (15) calcadar days of receipt of the written request of the registered or and delivery of a new Note, anyment therefor shall be made as scheduled in lieu of issuing a new Note. In every case the registered owner shall certify in writing as to the destruction, theft, or loss of such Note, and shall provide indemnification satisfactory to the County and to the Note Registrar, if required by the County and the Note Registrar.

Any notice to the contrary notwithstanding, the County and all of the officials, employees, and agents thereof, including the Note Registrar, may deem and treat the registered owner of the Notes as the absolute owner thereof for all purposes, including, but not limited to, payment of the principal thereof, and the interest thereon, regardless of whether such payment shall then be overdue.

- Section 10. Authentication. Only such of the Notes as shall have endorsed thereon a certificate of authentication, substantially in the form set forth in Exhibit "A" hereto duly executed by the Note Registrar shall be entitled to the rights, beachis, and security of this Resolution. No Note shall be valid or obligatory for any purpose unless, and until, such certificate of authentication shall have been duly executed by the Note Registrar. Such executed certificate of authentication by the Note Registrar upon any such Note shall be conclusive evidence that such Note has been duly authenticated and delivered under this Resolution as of the date of authentication.
- Section 11. Source of Parament and Security. The Notes, as to both principal and interest, shall be payable from funds of the County legally available therefor and to the extent necessary from ad valorem taxes to be levied on all taxable property within the corporate limits of the County without limitation as to time, rate, or amount. Said Notes shall be a direct general obligation of the County, for which the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the Notes, the full faith and credit of the County is irrevocably pledged.
- Section 12. Levy of Taxes. For the purpose of providing for the payment of the principal of and interest on the Notes, to the extent necessary, there shall be levied in each year in which such Notes shall be outstanding a direct tax on all taxable property in the County, fully sufficient to pay all such principal and interest falling due prior to the time of collection of the next succeeding tax levy. Said tax shall be assessed, collected, and paid at the time, and in the same manner, as the other taxes of said County, shall be in addition to all other taxes, and shall be without limitation as to time, rate, or amount, and for that purpose there is hereby levied a direct annual tax in such amount as may be found necessary each year to pay said principal of and interest on the Notes maturing in said year. Principal or interest falling due at any time when there shall be insufficient funds on hand from such tax levy for the payment thereof shall be paid from the general fund or other available funds of the County, but reimbursement therefor may be made from the taxes herein provided when the same shall have been collected. Such taxes levied and collected therefor shall be deposited in the County's debt service fund and used solely for the payment of principal of and interest on the Notes as the same shall become due.
- Section 13. Activities of Director of Local Government Finence. Anything herein contained to the contrary notwithstanding, no Notes authorized under this Resolution shall be issued, sold, or delivered, unless and until such Notes shall first have been duly approved by the Director of Local Government Finance, as provided by Section 9-21-601 et. seq. Tennessee Code Annotated, as amended. The County Mayor, County Clerk, and Attorney for the County, are hereby authorized to take or cause to be taken such steps as are nexassary to obtain such approval. After the issuance and sale of the Notes, and for each year that any of the Notes are outstanding, the County shall submit its annual budget to the Director of Local Government Finance for approval immediately upon the County's adoption of the budget.
- Section 14. Sale of Notes. The Notes herein authorized are authorized to be sold by the County Mayor by the informal bid process at a price of not less than part and annual interest.
- Section 15. Disposition of Note Proceeds. The proceeds from the sale of the Notes shall be paid to the official of the County designated by law as the custodian of the funds thereof to be deposited in a special fund known as the "School System Capital Outlay Notes Project Fund" (the "Project Fund"), which is hereby authorized to be created, to be kept separate and apart from all other funds of the County. The monies in the Project Fund shall be disbursed solely to finance the Project. Monies in the Project Fund and shall be secured in the manner prescribed by applicable statutes relative to the investment and securing of public or trust funds. Any monies remaining in the Project Fund after completion of the Project shall be transferred to the County's debt service fund and used to pay debt service on the Notes.
- Section 16. Designation of Notes as Qualified Tax-Exempt Obligations. The County hereby designates the Notes as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" within the meaning and for the purpose of Section 265(b)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. The County reasonably anticipates that the amount of tax-exempt obligations (other than obligations described in Section 265(b)(3)(C)(ii)) which will be issued during the calendar year by the County (i) any issuer with respect to which the County is deemed to be an "on behalf of" issuer, and (ii) all subordinate entities which are treated as one issuer under Section 265(b)(3)(E) of the Code, will not exceed \$10,000,000, and not more than \$10,000,000 of obligations issued by the County (together with those issued by any other issuers that are treated as on issuer under such Section 265(b)(3)) during the 2021 calendar year will be designated as "qualified tax-exempt obligations".
- Section 17. Non-Arbitrage Certification. The County certifies and covenants with the owner of the Notes that so long as the principal of any Note remains unpaid, monies on deposit in any fund or account in connection with the Notes, whether or not such monies were derived from the proceeds of the sale of the Notes or from any other source, will not be used in a manner which will cause the Notes to be "arbitrage bonds" within the meaning of Section 148 of the Code, and any lawful regulations promulgated thereunder, as the same presently exist, or may from time to time hereafter be amended, supplemented or revised. The County reserves the right, however, to make any investment of such monies permitted by Temessee law and this Resolution if, when and to the extent that said Section 148 or regulations promulgated thereunder shall be repealed or relaxed or shall be held void by final decision of a court of competent jurisdiction, but only if any investment made by virtue of such repeal, relaxation, or decision would not, in the opinion of counsed of recognized competence in such matters, result in making the interest on the Notes subject to inclusion in gross income of the owner thereof for federal income tax purposes.

The County covenants that it shall comply with Section 148(f) of the Code, unless legally exempted therefrom and it represents that in the event it shall be required by Section 148(f) of the Code to pay "Rebatable Arbitrage," as defined in the regulations promulgated under the Code, to the United States Government, it will make such payments as and when required by said Section 148(f) and will take such other actions as shall be necessary or permitted to prevent the interest on the Notes from becoming subject to inclusion in federal gross income of the owner of the Notes for purposes of federal income taxation.

- Section 18. Resolution a Commet. The provisions of this Resolution shall constitute a contract between the County and the owner of the Notes, and after the issuance of the Notes, no change, variation, or alteration of any kind in the provisions of this Resolution shall be made in any manner, until such time as all installments of the principal of and interest on the Notes shall have been paid in full or the consent of the registered owner of the Notes has been obtained; provided, however, that the County is hereby authorized to make such amendments to this Resolution as will not impair the rights or security of the owner of the Notes.
- Section 19. No Action to be Taken Affecting Validity of the Notes. The County hereby covenants and agrees that it will not take any action, that would in any manner affect the validity of the Notes or limit the rights and remedies of the owner from time to time of such Notes. The County further covenants that it will not take any action that will cause the interest on the Notes to be subject to inclusion in gross income of the owner thereof for purposes of federal income taxation.
- Section 20. Miscellaneous Acts. The County Mayor, the County Clerk, and all other appropriate officials of the County are hereby authorized, empowered, and directed to do any and all such acts and things, and to execute, acknowledge, and deliver all such documents, instruments, and certifications, in addition to those acts, things, documents, instruments, and certifications hereinbefore authorized and approved, as may in their discretion, be necessary or desirable to implement or comply with the intent of this Resolution; or any of the documents herein authorized and approved; or for the authorization, issuance, and delivery of the Notes.
- Section 21. Failure to Present Notes. Subject to the provisions of Section 3 hereof, in the event any Note shall not be presented for payment when the principal becomes due at maturity and in the event monies sufficient to pay such Note shall be held by the Note Registrar for the benefit of the owner thereof, all liability of the County to such owner for the payment of such Note shall forthwith cease, terminate, and be completely discharged. Thereupon, the Note Registrar shall hold such monies, without liability for interest thereon, for the benefit of the owner of such Note who shall thereafter be resided exclusively to such monies for any claim under this Resolution or on, or with respect to, said Note, subject to escheat or other similar law, and any applicable statute of limitation.
- Section 22.

 Payments Due on Saturdays, and Holidays. Whenever the interest on or principal of any Note is due on a Saturday or Sunday or, at the place designated for payment, a legal holiday or a day on which banking institutions are authorized by law to close, then the payment of the interest on, or the principal of, such Note need not be made on such date but must be made on the next succeeding day not a Saturday, Sunday, or a legal holiday or a day upon which banking institutions are authorized by law to close, with the same force and effect as if made on the date of maturity; and no interest shall accrue for the period after such date.
- Section 23. No Recourse Under Resolution on Notes. All stipulations, promises, agreements, and obligations of the County contained in this Resolution shall be deemed to be the stipulations, promises, agreements, and obligations of the County in his or her individual capacity,

and no recourse shall be had for the payment of the principal of or interest on the Notes or for any claim based thereon or under this Resolution against any officer, director, or employee of the County or against any official or individual executing the Notes.

Section 24. Severability. If any section, paragraph, or provision of this Resolution shall be held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the invalidity or ty of such section, paragraph, or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions hereof.

Section 25. Repeal of Conflicting Resolutions and Effective Date. All resolutions and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provise extent of such conflict, hereby repealed, and this Resolution shall be in effect as of the date of its adoption the welfare of the County requiring it.
