

### **CITIZENS FORUM**

Anthony Beal, Employee at the Benton County Sheriff's Office, spoke about the amount the employee raises and safety of the Jail.

Big Sandy Mayor Autumn Ratliff is asking for support upgrading the sewer system in Big Sandy. They have applied for several grants but this is a very costly project.

Mayor Lashlee responded that the overall size of the completed sewer project is estimated to be around 2 million dollars. Benton County will be allocating \$500,000 from the Federal Rescue Grant to the project to supplement the grants for Big Sandy.

### **COMMISSIONERS FORUM**

Commissioner Presson spoke about the TVA payment in lieu of taxes.

## <u>COUNTY MAYOR, ATTORNEY, FINANCE ADVISOR, INVITED GUEST SPEAKER</u> FORUM, OR PROCLAMATIONS

Sheriff Christopher spoke about his jail employees pay is too low. Employees are leaving because they can make more money in other counties. He said he has 16 employees that have been there less than a year and that is unacceptable. He said if he loses many more employees, they will have to consider housing inmates elsewhere. He asked that the commissioners consider his budget proposal for necessary raises for his employees.

Bob Bass, TCI, spoke about the Jail system and proper staffing and pay. He said every county around us has their start out pay at the rate our jail employees top out at. Decatur County starting out pay is \$13.98 and Benton County is \$11.02.

Mayor Lashlee said they have been working on the Jail pay issue for about 3 years. He says our commission has worked hard to get the pay issues adjusted.

Mayor Lashlee honored Lydia Branch with the following proclamation:

## PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, Benton County suffered the loss of a valued member and leader of our community on October 19, 2020, with the death of Lydia Joan Laux Branch; and

WHEREAS, Lydia Laux Branch was born July 8, 1932, in Elmhurst, Illinois to George Theodore Laux and Linnie Josephine Hatley Laux. Lydia's father, George, worked for the Standard Oil Company in Chicago, Illinois, starting in 1898, delivering oil by horse and wagon. He retired after 44 years and moved his family permanently to a farm in Camden, Benton County, TN.

WHEREAS, Lydia was the second of eight children born to this union. George moved Linnie and the children several times while he was working in Chicago. Some years they would live in Camden close to the Hatley family, and other years in Chicago. Eight of her childhood years Lydia lived in different suburbs of Chicago, and twelve were spent in Camden. After the death of the Laux parents Lydia and her sister, Jean, continued to provide a home for their six remaining siblings. Lydia always considered Camden her home. She married native, Billy George Branch, and raised her three children; David, Linda, and Carol there. After Linda's death, Lydia had the responsibility of rearing her grandchildren, Angela Moss and Kimberly Moss Conn.

WHEREAS, During the late 1960's Lydia began working on her Master's Degree at MTSU in "Aerospace Education". This was a new program designed to help teachers be prepared to teach it in high schools. Lydia was the first of 3 ladies to receive their Diplomas May 29, 1971. Lydia assisted MTSU in training other teachers and developing courses for high school students. She also introduced Aerospace Education in the Benton County Schools. Many of her students continued in Military or aircraft work after high school.

WHEREAS, Lydia obtained her pilot license and co-purchased her own plane for personal flying. She was an active member in the *Civil Air Patrol* and the *National Congress on Aviation & Space Education* where she was the Recorder for two consecutive years. At a meeting in 1984, Lydia met Astronauts Chuck Yeager and Paul Garber. Chuck Yeager encouraged Lydia to apply for the "NASA Teacher in

Space Project". Lydia, believing she could fly in the Space Shuttle Missile as needed, submitted her application. She was highly considered, but was not the final selection.

WHEREAS, Lydia was a well-known figure to most Benton Countians due to her 55 plus years of service in the Benton County Education System. She was certified in 8 areas, and during her 32 years of classroom instruction, she taught all areas either in Holladay, Camden, Big Sandy or Huntingdon Schools. In addition, she taught Vocational and Adult Education. Lydia was also an outstanding coach; her Holladay Jr High Girls Basketball Team of 1955-56 was undefeated, and won the tournament. She introduced Volleyball to the Holladay and Big Sandy Schools. Lydia loved the classroom and continued to substitute teach until she was 81 years old.

WHEREAS, Lydia was always active in church activities and teaching Bible classes at the Camden church of Christ. In 1964, before the days of Kindergarten, Lydia started a free, and open to the public, preschool class at a small house next to the old Camden church building. Lydia developed her own materials, and she did not get paid. Later in life she volunteered to teach the youth during mission work in Latin America.

**WHEREAS,** Lydia's never-ending caring for others, and selfless kind-hearted nature, was spread throughout the community. She had a lifelong listing of honors bestowed upon her throughout her life. Some of which were:

- August 12, 2003, "Modern Woodmen of America Award"
- June 18, 2004, "Sequoyah Literacy Award" by The Tennessee Historical Commission
- August 1, 2005, "Certificate of Appreciation" from State of Tennessee by Gov. Phil Bredesen in recognition of her outstanding service in the best interests and in the highest traditions of the State of TN.
- February 25, 2014, "Lifetime Achievement Award" by the Benton County Chamber of Commerce
- May 17, 2014, "Benton County Athletic Hall of Fame" (first year and first woman)

## **PROCLAMATION**

WHEREAS, these awards were all well-deserved and a by-product of her motivation to always do her best and promote others.

WHEREAS, Lydia Joan Laux Branch, age 88, passed away on October 19, 2020, peacefully at her charming log house in the country with her loving family by her side. Although she is no longer with us, she has left a legacy behind that has made Benton County, her family, friends and associates a better place in which to live. Her understanding of life and people in general, her spiritedness, enthusiasm, and her drive to educate herself and others surpass none other.

WHEREAS, Benton County lost a strong, forward-thinking leader, and a generous and knowledgeable community mentor; and

WHEREAS, Lydia Branch took the responsibility of being a true caregiver to many throughout the Benton County community, her sense of both kindness and graciousness enriched those fortunate enough to know and work with her; and

WHEREAS, her true legacy lies in the profound effect she had on the countless men/women and students that she mentored and taught throughout her career.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** By the Board of Commissioners of Benton County, Tennessee assembled in regular session on this the 21<sup>st</sup> Day of June 2021, that the Benton County community recognizes the significant contributions and remarkable achievements of Lydia Joan Laux Branch over the course of her distinguished career and community involvement in Benton County.
